This half-term our theme will be Once Upon a

Week 1 and 2: The Three Little Pigs

To kick start our unit on traditional tales, we will be reading 'The Three Little Pigs'. During this unit, we will be learning about materials and their properties as well as designing and making our own house for The Three Little Pigs. Which houses will survive the 'huffs and puffs' of the Big Bad Wolf!

Week 3: The Three Billy Goats Gruff

This week we will be reading 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. We will be learning about nouns and adjectives in English and using these to describe some of the characters in the book.

Week 4 and 5: Goldilocks and the Three Bears

During these two weeks we will be learning about the story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. We will be thinking about the characters in the story and the decisions they make. But who ate the porridge?

Week 6: The Enormous Turnip

To finish our theme, we will be reading the book 'The Enormous Turnip'. We will be learning to retell this story using a story map to help us.

Literacy

We will continue to have their daily RWInc lessons. In Writing we will continue to teach the children to write their names accurately. We will be teaching the children to write simple dictated phrases and sentences using their Fred fingers to pinch the sounds in the words to spell them accurately. We will introduce capital letters and full stops to start and finish a sentence. We will be learning what a noun and an adjective is and using these words to write descriptions of the characters.

Handwritina

We will be reviewing the long-legged giraffe letters and one-armed robot letters.

We will then move onto the curly caterpillar letters: c, a, d, o, s

PSHE

This half-term we will be learning about belonging to a community. We will start the year my thinking about our class community and our classroom expectation so everyone can be happy, safe and learn. Maths

This half-term we will be learning to recognise and order numbers to 5 and match numbers to quantities. We will be finding different ways to make 5 and arranging 5 in the part-whole model.

We will then be learning about 6 and 7, knowing that 6 is made of 5 and 1 and 7 is made of 5 and 2.

We will be consolidated our understanding more than and fewer than, using this vocabulary to describe groups of objects.



How to help:

- Continue to count forwards and backwards.
 Practise starting at different numbers e.g. 4
- Count toys at home by putting them in a line.
- Have a go at subitising a small group of objects.
 Count them to check if you were correct.
- Ask your child to show you one more or one less using objects.
- Use the part-whole model to make numbers
- Can you find different shapes at home and when out and about? Can you name the shape and say how many sides and corners it has?

Oracy

This half-term we will be focusing the four strands of oracy:

Physical: maintain eye contact with a partner or familiar adult.

Cognitive: ask a relevant question about a story.

Social and Emotional: use the words of the week accurately in conversation. **Linguistic:** to take turns to speak when working in learning partners.

PE – Gymnastics

Move in high ways, explore making high shapes, move in a low way, explore making low shapes, move safely using apparatus.

Science – Materials and their Properties

Know what a material is, identify and name materials, know the names of properties materials have, identify properties, suggest a purpose for a material.

Geography – My Local Area

Know I live in Southend-on-Sea in England, recognise a UK map, know where Southend is on a map. Identify human and physical features of our school grounds, create simple maps.

RE – What stories are special and why?

Explore sculptures, design a park sculpture,

Explore joining techniques, design a house for the Three Little Pigs, construct my house, evaluate my house.
