# AOB Raised by Parent Forum:

- Outdoor Learning: my child in Year I said that they have only been able to go into parts of the outdoor learning area and for a shorter time during the sessions in December and January (due to animal holes I think) and then said that they didn't do any activities for their outdoor learning session last week. Is there any feedback on when the area be will back in action/when they will be able to have sessions as they used to? We do have a huge Badger set who have created many holes and we have had to corner off this area. We are in touch with Nature England and exploring the correct steps that we could put in place to try and possibly rehome the badgers. Unfortunately it is breeding season at the moment so we are unable to do anything for a couple of months. It is also quite slippy out there at the moment so parts have been out of bounds and we have had to use other outside areas. The weather was hail and heavy showers last week, so the Year1 children did only get some pockets of time.
