Read Write Inc. Phonics

- For children in Reception, Yr1 and Yr2 who are learning to read.
- We assess every 6 weeks and organise the children into groups based on their stage of reading.

Read Write Inc. Phonics daily lessons

- We teach sounds, practice reading and spelling words with these sounds, then give children decodable books containing sounds and words they can read.



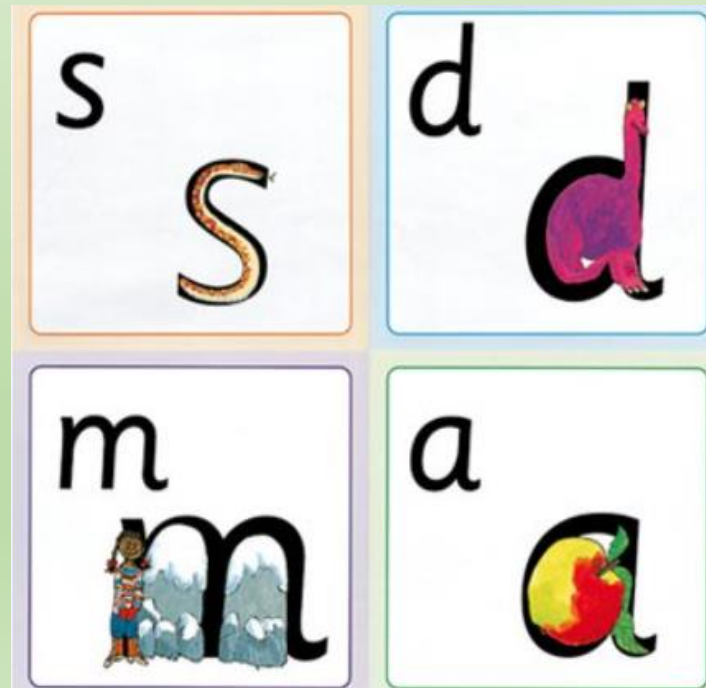
One-to-one tutoring – ‘keep up, not catch up!’

- Some children need extra practice.
- 10 minutes every day.



What is phonics?

- Sounds – all words are made up of individual sounds.
- Graphemes – the name for the letters we use to write the sound.
- Phonics is a method of teaching reading through the identification of sounds and graphemes



English alphabetic code

- 44 sounds
- 26 letters
- Over 150+ grapheme (letter combinations)
- One of the most complex alphabetic codes in the world.

Speed Sounds Set 1

- We teach using pure sounds.
- We pronounce sounds clearly.

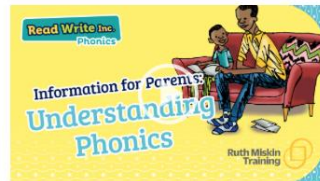
