


Speed Sounds Set 2

 Set 2 sounds are shaded. They are long vowel sounds with 2 or more letters – Special Friends.



Speed Sounds Set 3





- Once children know how to read Set 2 sounds, they start to learn Set 3 sounds.
- They are alternative graphemes (spelling of a sound) for the Set 1 and Set 2 sounds.

Picture Phrases




 We use picture phrases to help children remember Set 2 and Set 3 sounds










Special Friends, Fred Talk, read the word
