This half-term our theme will be Once Upon a Time

Week 1: Humpty Dumpty

To kick start our unit about nursery thymes and traditional tales, we will be reading 'Humpty Dumpty'. During this unit, we will be learning about materials and what they can be used for. Which material would be best to build a wall?

Week 2: Jack and Jill

This week we will be reading 'Jack and Jill'. We will be learning to identify the events in a story, name the characters and talk about the beginning and end of the story.

Week 3: Little Red Riding Hood

This week we will be learning about the story 'Little Red Riding Hood'. We will be thinking about the characters in the story and the decisions they make.

Week 4: The Elves and the Shoemaker

This week we will start our DT unit to explore and make felt shoes. We will enjoy designing our shoes, exploring how to join fabric together and decorating them.

Week 5: The Magic Porridge Pot

Exploring changing materials we will be the theme for this week. We will listen to the story and talk about the oats changed into porridge and then we will explore changing materials.

Week 7: Jack and the Beanstalk

This week we will be listening to the story and talking about the characters. In aeography we will enjoy creating simple maps for Jack.

PSHE

This half-term we will be learning about belonging to a community and start our unit on media literacy and digital resilience.

We will learn about our class being our community and the importance of having class values and expectations. We will learn about having rules in different situations such as our classroom, the dinning hall, the library, the park. We then think about right and wrong choices and why it is important to make the right choice. We will link this to how to be a good friend. In our second unit we will learn about different types of digital devices and talk about some of the games we play at home on them.

Maths

We have daily Maths Meetings where we sing, 'Days of the week'. Each day we will say what the day and date is. We will also talk about the weather.

During our maths lessons we be learning to use our fingers to quickly show different quantities. We will be learning to recognise numerals to 5, put them in order and count up to 5 objects. We will be practising counting forwards and backwards to 5 and to build towers from 1 to 5 and put them in order. We will then be thinking about what groups have more than, fewer than or an equal amount.

In shape, space and measure we will be learning about shapes with 4 sides such as sauares and rectangles.

- Look at and name different numbers to 5.
